


Leila helped her little brother give Mac a carrot. "Keep your hand open," Leila said.

Mac neighed. Sam giggled at the bells on the reins.



Norm joined his neighbors and friends. People cheered. He smiled sadly and put up his hands.


"Neighbors," he said, "tonight ends forty-eight years of sleigh rides. I am moving. I am going to move near my daughter."

Leila frowned. "I have to think of a way to keep him," she said.






Leila walked slowly into the Perkinses' feed store. She saw Peg weighing a bag. Ross was stacking boxes.

Leila cleared her throat. "Will you please help me keep Mac in town?" She crossed her fingers hopefully.






"How can I help?" asked Peg.


"I would love to keep Mac in town," said Peg. "Ross and I could give him free feed. But we don't have a place for a horse and sleigh. We store things in the shed."
