She got up and went to see her father the king about it.

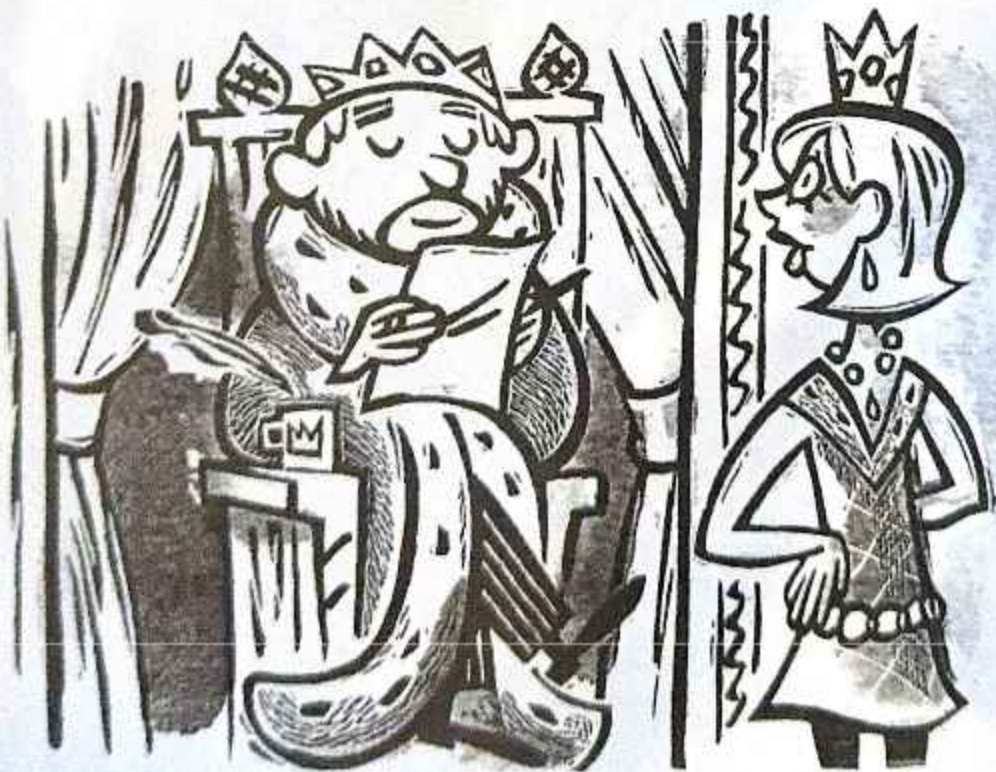


"Father!" she said. "This kingdom is too noisy. Wouldn't it be wonderful without noise?"
