Possessive adjectives, possessive pronouns, and possessive apostrophe ('s, s') all show ownership, but they're used differently.

Туре	Words	Used For	Example Sentence
Personal Pronouns		Replace names or nouns	She is my friend.
Possessive Adjectives	my, your, his, her, its, our, their	Show ownership <b>before</b> a noun	That is <i>my</i> book.
Possessive Pronouns		Show ownership <b>alone</b> (no noun after)	The book is <i>mine</i> .
Possessive Apostrophe ('s)	's or s'	Show ownership <b>for</b> <b>nouns</b>	That is <i>Anna's</i> bag. / Those are <i>the teachers'</i> cars.

- Use 's after a singular noun: Tom's bike, the cat's tail
- Use s' after a plural noun ending in -s: the girls' uniforms, the teachers' room
- Don't use an apostrophe with possessive pronouns: **X** *her's*, *∜ hers*

## **Examples:**

• I love my cat.

I = personal pronoun, my = possessive adjective.

• This is her bag.

"her" shows the bag belongs to her.

This bag is hers.

"hers" is a possessive pronoun (no noun after).

• This is John's pen.

"John's" uses an apostrophe to show ownership (John + 's).

• The dogs' owner is friendly.

The owner belongs to **several dogs**, so the apostrophe goes **after s**.

<b>X</b> Wrong		Why
This is my	This is mine	Use mine when no noun follows.
He likes her's car	He likes her car	Hers never takes an apostrophe.
It's color is blue	Its color is blue	It's = it is; its shows possession.
That is the teachers's room	That is the teachers' room	Add apostrophe <b>after s</b> for plural nouns.
