Sentence Writing Guidelines Worksheet

1. What Is a Sentence?

A sentence is a complete idea.

It must have:

- A subject (who or what the sentence is about)
- **A verb** (what the subject does or is)
- A complete thought

Examples:

- She runs fast.
- The teacher is kind.
- My friends play football every weekend.

\square Not complete sentences:

- Running fast.
- Because I like pizza.
- The big dog.

2. The Basic Sentence Formula

Subject + Verb + (Object/Extra Information)

Example	Formula
I eat apples.	Subject + Verb + Object
He plays football in the park.	Subject + Verb + Object + Place
The sun rises in the east.	Subject + Verb + Place
