Past simple

Use the past simple to talk about what happened in the past.

Use was with I, HE, SHE, IT and were with WE, YOU and THEY.

Add not to make a sentence negative.

Change the word order to make a question.

Add <u>-ed</u> to regular verbs for all subjects.

Use didn't (did not) and the base form of the verb to make a negative.

Use did and the base form in questions.

*Past simple: be

Affirmative: subject + be (was/were) + the rest of the sentence.

Negative: subject + be (was/were) + not + the rest of the sentence.

Question: was/were + subject + the rest of the sentence?

It was their first concert.

It wasn't easy.

Were the instruments expensive?

Yes, they were. / No, they weren't.

*Past simple: regular verbs

Affirmative: subject + verb (2) + the rest of the sentence.

Negative: subject + didn't + verb (1) + the rest of the sentence.

Question: did + subject + verb (1) + the rest of the sentence?

In 2012, they visited Brazil.

The children didn't play instruments then.

Did you guess? Yes, I did. / No, I didn't

 We form the affirmative of regular verbs by adding -ed at the end.

Ex: watch - watched

• When the verb ends in -e, we just add -d.

Ex: move - moved

When the verb ends in a consonant + -y, we take off the -y and add
 -ied.

Ex: cry - cried

• When the verb ends in a vowel + -y, we just add -ed.

Ex: stay - stayed

• When the verb ends in consonant + vowel + consonant, we double the last consonant and add -ed only if the <u>last syllable</u> is stressed.

Ex: rip - ripped

But if the <u>last syllable isn't</u> stressed, we <u>don't</u> double the last consonant.

Ex: listen - listened

• When the verb ends in -1, we double the -1 and add -ed.

Ex: Travel- travelled

- In the negative form, we use did, the word not and the bare infinitive.

They didn't fly to Holland.

- In the question form, we use did and the bare infinitive. In short answers, we use did. We don't use the main verb.

Did you watch a film last night?

Yes, we did. / No, we didn't.

* Keywords:

- Yesterday
- Last (e.g., last night, last week, last month, last year)
- Ago (e.g., two days ago, a week ago, years ago)
- In [specific year or time] (e.g., in 1990, in the 18th century)
- On [specific day/date] (e.g., on Monday, on my birthday, on January 1st)

Examples:

I was at my grandma's house yesterday. She was with her friends last Saturday. We were happy yesterday.

I was hungry this morning.

You were in the garden yesterday.

It was sunny yesterday.

They were at the beach last weekend.

I was not late for school this morning. = I wasn't late for school this morning.

He was not at home last Monday. = He wasn't at home last Monday. We were not cold yesterday. = We weren't cold yesterday.

Were you tired this morning? Yes, I was.

Was she at the park last Sunday? No, she wasn't.
