Read the excerpt below from the text in your book, then answer the questions that follow.

The pattern known as tartan is used in Scotland to make kilts — a kind of skirt for men. However, visitors to modern-day Scotland are unlikely to see many kilts out on the streets — the best way to see people wearing tartan is to visit the Highland Games, sporting events held throughout the summer. The rules state that Scots who compete must wear a kilt to compete. Tartan crossed the Atlantic with the Scots who settled in North America, where <u>it</u> is called 'plaid'. Americans later invented their own designs to reflect the colours of the Wild West, and they became a favourite of cowboys. Plaid even went to the moon with astronaut Alan Bean in Apollo. Although he was an American, Bean's family (who had their own special tartan pattern) had originally come from Scotland.

Sample Essay

Weekly quizzes is it a beneficial thing or a stressful procedure? I believe that having weekly quizzes is a good idea, because they help students become more responsible learners. As regular testing keeps students focused and motivated to study throughout the term.

Firstly, weekly quizzes encourage students to revise lessons regularly. Instead of leaving studying until the last minute, they review what they learn every week, which helps them remember information for longer.

Secondly, frequent quizzes reduce summative exams stress. When students are tested often, they get used to exams and feel more confident during major tests.

Teachers can also notice who needs extra help early.

In conclusion, weekly quizzes make learning organized and less stressful, while improving both understanding and performance. In the beginning they are stressful but later students become familiar with this.
