He bought a new house last month.

Simple past formation

#### Affirmative Form :-

Subject + Verb 2 + Complement .

- \* I watched a nice movie last night.(Regular verb)
- \* She <u>came</u> early yesterday .(Irregular verb)

# Negative Form :-

Subject + didn't + Verb 1 + Complement.

- \*I didn't call her yesterday.
- \* He didn't miss the class last week.

# Question Form:-

(Did) + Subject + Inf.v + Complement?

Did you call me yesterday?

Ending in consonant + y change y to i and add ed	t <b>ry</b> – tr <mark>ied</mark> car <b>ry</b> – carried		
One syllable, single vowel and ending in single consonant double the final consonant and add ed	n <mark>od</mark> – nodded rip - ripped		
Two-syllable, stress on second syllable and ending in single consonant double the final consonant and add ed	comm <mark>it – committed</mark> pref <b>er</b> – prefe <mark>rred</mark>
