



# 2. The Past Simple is used to describe actions that started and finished in the past.


It is often paired with specific time expressions that clarify when the action took place.

\*\*Form:\*\*

Subject + Verb (past form) + Object

Example: He **visited** the museum.

### 1. Past Simple with Regular Verbs



Here's how to form the past simple with regular verbs:

1. If the verb ends with (e) we add (d)

Move ---- live<u>d</u> live ---- live<u>d</u>

Like ---- like**d** use ---- use**d** 

2. If the verb ends with one vowel + consonant, we double the last letter then add (ed)

Stop ---- stop<u>ped</u> step ---- step<u>ped</u>

Skip --- skip**ped** rub ----- rub**bed** 

3. If the verb ends with two vowels + consonant letter we just add (ed)

Rain ---- rained

need ---- needed

Cook ----- cook<u>ed</u>

4. If the verb ends with

a. Vowel + y play --- played

b. Vowel + x fix ----- fixed

c. Vowel + w show ---- showed snow --- snowed

We don't double the last letter, only add (ed)

5. If the verb ends with consonant letter + y we drop the (Y) then add (ied)

Study ---- studied

tidy ---- tid<u>ied</u>

Carry ---- carried

2. Negative Form with Regular Verbs...

To make a sentence **negative** in the past simple with regular verbs, use **did not (didn't) + base form** 

**Examples:** 

I play<u>ed</u> soccer
 She watch<u>ed</u> TV.
 I <u>didn't play</u> soccer.
 She <u>didn't watch</u> TV.

3. Question Form with Regular Verbs

To ask a question in the past simple, start with <u>Did</u>, <u>the person</u>, then <u>the</u> base form of the verb.

Examples:

1. You played soccer. Did you play soccer?

2. He watch the movie. **Did he watch** the movie?
