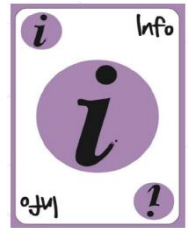

### Past Simple with Regular Verbs and Verb "To Be"



## 1. **WAS - WERE** TO BE - Past Tense

### AFFIRMATIVE

I was happy.  
He was hungry.  
She was a nurse.  
It was big.

We were early.  
You were at school.  
They were quiet.

### NEGATIVE

I wasn't sad.  
He wasn't thirsty.  
She wasn't a teacher.  
It wasn't small.

We weren't late.  
You weren't at home.  
They weren't noisy.

wasn't =  
was not

weren't =  
were not

### QUESTIONS

+ Affirmative They were happy.

She was rich.

? Question Were they happy?

Was she rich?

Short Answer Yes, they were / No, they weren't

Yes, she was / No, she wasn't

2. The Past Simple **is used to describe actions that started and finished in the past.**

It is often paired with specific time expressions that clarify when the action took place.


**\*\*Form:\*\***

**Subject + Verb (past form) + Object**

Example: He **visited** the museum.

### 1. Past Simple with Regular Verbs

**PAST -ed SPELLING**  
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INFINITIVE	PAST	SPELLING
watch play	watch <u>e</u> d play <u>e</u> d	➔ general rule add <b>-ed</b>
like arrive	lik <u>e</u> d arriv <u>e</u> d	➔ after <b>-e</b> add <b>-d</b>
study try	stud <u>i</u> ed tr <u>y</u> ed	➔ after consonant + <b>-y</b> delete <b>-y</b> and add <b>-ied</b>
stop rob	stop <u>p</u> ed rob <u>b</u> ed	➔ consonant + vowel + cons. double consonant + <b>-ed</b>

Here's **how to form the past simple with regular verbs:**

**1. If the verb ends with ( e ) we add ( d )**

Move ---- movedd                      live ---- livedd

Like ----- likedd                      use ----- usedd

**2. If the verb ends with one vowel + consonant, we double the last letter then add ( ed )**

Stop ----- stopped                      step ----- stepped

Skip --- skipped                      rub ----- rubbed

### 3. If the verb ends with two vowels + consonant letter we just add ( ed)

Rain ---- raineded

need ----- neededed

Cook ----- cookeded

### 4. If the verb ends with

a. Vowel + y      play --- playeded

b. Vowel + x      fix ----- fixeded

c. Vowel + w      show ---- showeded      snow --- snoweded

We don't double the last letter, only add ( ed)

### 5. If the verb ends with consonant letter + y we drop the (Y) then add ( ied)

Study ---- studiedied

tidy ---- tidiedied

Carry ---- carriedied

## 2. Negative Form with Regular Verbs...

To make a sentence **negative** in the past simple with regular verbs, use **did not (didn't) + base form**

Examples:

1. I playeded soccer

I **didn't play** soccer.

2. She watcheded TV.

She **didn't watch** TV.

## 3. Question Form with Regular Verbs

To ask a question in the past simple, start with **Did, the person,** then **the base form of the verb.**

Examples:

1. You playeded soccer.

**Did you play** soccer?

2. He watcheded the movie.

**Did he watch** the movie?
