Mysterious Places





Learning objective: Students should be able to know how to write a story.

When writing a story:

- 1. Spend a few minutes thinking about how you want your story to develop, and then make some notes.
- 2. Make sure you include a clear beginning, middle and end.
- 3. Set the scene in the first paragraph and create a strong atmosphere.
- 4. Use narrative tenses such as simple past and the past continuous.
- 5. Remember to include adjectives and adverbs to add drama and suspense.

Key elements of a short story

Setting

The time and location in which a story takes place is called the setting. This is where you can set the scene with mood/atmosphere.

Conflict

Conflict is essential to plot. It usually takes place towards the start of the story.

Character

Short stories use few characters. One character is central to the story with all major events having some importance to this character - he/she is the PROTAGONIST. The opposer of the main character is called the ANTAGONIST.

Point of view

Who is telling the story? Is it first person or third person narrative?

Plot

The plot is how the author arranges events to develop his/her basic idea; It is the sequence of events in a story or play.

<u>Theme</u>

The theme is its controlling idea. It is the author's underlying meaning or main idea that he/she is trying to convey. This could be a moral theme e.g. "don't judge a book by its cover".

If you use this list, you can check that you have included everything you need to in your short story.

- 1. **Title**: Have you included a title that accurately reflects the content of your story?
- 2. Exposition: Have you introduced the characters, setting, and plot of your story in a clear and concise manner?
- 3. Action part: Have you included a sequence of events or actions that develop the conflict and engage the reader?
- 4. **Resolution**: Have you provided a satisfactory conclusion to your story that ties up any loose ends and provides a resolution to the conflict?
- 5. Adjectives and Adverbs: Have you used descriptive words (adjectives) and words that describe actions (adverbs) to create vivid imagery and convey your story's mood and tone?
- 6. Narrative tenses: Have you used the appropriate narrative tenses (simple past, past continuous, past perfect, past perfect continuous) to tell your story consistently and clearly?
- 7. Clear ideas: Have you organized your story in a logical and coherent manner, ensuring that your ideas are expressed in a clear and concise manner?

Example 1:

What a terrible day

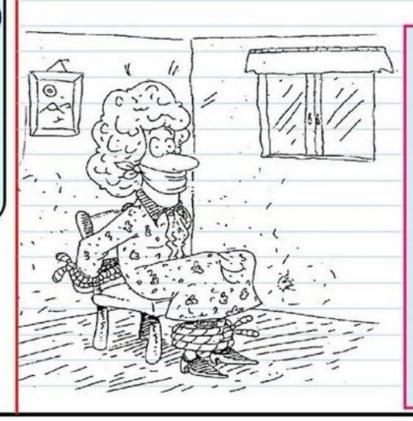
