- was studying → past continuous
- published, said, found → past simple
- had increased → past perfect simple

#### **Exercise C: Rules**

- 1. We use **Past Perfect** to make clear that a past action happened earlier than another past action.
- 2. We use **Past Perfect Simple** to talk about an earlier completed action.
- 3. We use **Past Perfect Continuous** to talk about a situation or action which continued up to a certain time in the past.

# **Grammar – Narrative Tenses (Past Perfect Simple & Continuous)**

	II A ction completed betore	Sales of the newspaper <b>had increased</b> dramatically before admitting the reports were false.	حدث مكتمل في الماضي قبل حدث آخر
	0 0	Animals <b>had been running</b> from the people before reaching the walls.	يركز على طول استمرار فعل في الماضي حتى نقطة معينة

#### **Rules:**

- 1. Past Perfect Simple  $\rightarrow$  for earlier completed actions.
- 2. Past Perfect Continuous  $\rightarrow$  for actions continuing up to a past point.
- 3. Past Perfect Simple or Continuous → depending on focus (completed vs. duration).

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
