<u>Learning objective</u>: Students should be able to be familiar with the difference between adjectives ending in **ed & ing**.

#### Do you know the difference between bored and boring?

Look at these examples to see how adjectives ending in -ed and -ing are used.

- -I was really bored in that presentation.
- -That was a really boring presentation.

### -ed adjectives

Adjectives that end in -ed generally describe emotions - they tell us how people feel.

I was so **bored** in that lesson, I almost fell asleep. He was **surprised** to see Helen after all those years. She was really **tired** and went to bed early.

#### -ing adjectives

Adjectives that end in -ing generally describe the thing that causes the emotion

- a boring lesson makes you feel bored.

Have you seen that film? It's really frightening.

I could listen to her for hours. She's so interesting.

I can't sleep! That noise is really annoying!
