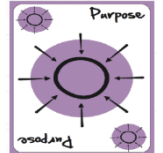

Learning objective: Students should be able to be familiar with the difference between adjectives ending in **ed & ing**.



Do you know the difference between *bored* and *boring*?

Look at these examples to see how adjectives ending in **-ed** and **-ing** are used.

-I was really **bored** in that presentation.

-That was a really **boring** presentation.

-ed adjectives

Adjectives that end in -ed generally describe emotions - they tell us how people feel.

*I was so **bored** in that lesson, I almost fell asleep.*

*He was **surprised** to see Helen after all those years.*

*She was really **tired** and went to bed early.*

-ing adjectives

Adjectives that end in -ing generally describe the thing that causes the emotion

- a boring lesson makes you feel bored.

*Have you seen that film? It's really **frightening**.*

*I could listen to her for hours. She's so **interesting**.*

*I can't sleep! That noise is really **annoying**!*
