Present Perfect: Simple vs Continuous

1. Present Perfect Simple

Form:

have/has + past participle

Use it to:

- 1. Talk about completed actions with a result in the present
 - o I have finished my homework. \rightarrow Now it's ready.
- 2. Talk about experiences in life (without specifying the time)
 - o She has visited Paris twice.
- 3. Talk about actions in a period of time that is not finished
 - o I have read three books this week.
- 4. With "already," "yet," "just," "ever," "never"
 - o Have you **ever tried** sushi?
 - o I have just eaten lunch.

Keywords: already, yet, just, ever, never, so far, up to now

2. Present Perfect Continuous

Form:

have/has + been + -ing

Use it to:

- 1. Talk about actions that started in the past and are still continuing
 - o I have been studying English for two hours.
- 2. Talk about actions that have just finished but show the result
 - o She has been running, and now she's out of breath.
- 3. Emphasize **duration** or **how long** something has been happening
 - o They have been working on the project all day.

Keywords: for, since, all day, recently, lately

3. Quick Comparison

Feature	Present Perfect Simple	Present Perfect Continuous
Focus	Result or completed action	Duration or activity itself
Example	I have cleaned the room.	I have been cleaning the room for 2 hours.
Keywords	already, just, yet, ever, never	for, since, all day, recently, lately

4. Examples

- 1. I have read five books this month. (Result: I finished 5 books)
- 2. I have been reading for two hours. (Focus: Activity + Duration)
- 3. She has painted the wall. (Result: Wall is painted)
- 4. She has been painting the wall all morning. (Duration + activity)

5. Common Mistakes

•	☐ I have been knowing her for 5 years.☐ I have known her for 5 years.
•	\Box I have cleaned the room for 2 hours.
	☐ I have been cleaning the room for 2 hours.
