How to Rewrite a Restaurant Review

Writing a good restaurant review requires balance, clarity, and polite language. In this lesson, students learn how to rewrite a negative or direct review so it becomes:

- ✓ less emotional
- ✓ more objective and polite
- ✓ more informative
- ✓ more useful to the reader.

This is a <u>simplified</u> guide.

1. Use Nominalisation to Make Writing Formal

Nominalisation = turning a verb into a noun to make the review more academic and less wordy.

Examples

 $Verb \rightarrow Noun$

- design → design
- recommend → recommendation
- *improve* → improvement

In the lesson:

Original sentence:

The designers used blue shades to create a relaxing eating area.

Better using nominalisation:

➡ The clever use of blue shades has created a relaxing eating area.

This helps the review sound more professional and balanced.

2. Use Synonyms to Avoid Repetition

Instead of repeating the same word (e.g., good, nice, bad), use synonyms.

Examples

- amazing → stunning
- duck → the meat
- disappointing → a letdown

This improves vocabulary and makes the review more interesting.

3. Show Comparison and Contrast

Restaurant reviews often compare with:

- other restaurants
- past experiences
- expectations

Useful phrases:

- In common with many restaurants...
- Similarly, other places have done the same...
- By way of contrast...

These help the reader understand whether the restaurant is better or worse than others.

4. Give a Recommendation

A review must help readers decide whether to visit the restaurant.

Useful recommendation phrases:

- I cannot praise it highly enough.
- If you are looking for somewhere new and exciting, then...
- This restaurant should be a first choice for celebrations.
- I would say that the restaurant does not score highly on value for money.

These sentences keep the review polite and useful.

5. Make the Review Less Direct (Less Harsh)

Very direct or emotional language can sound rude. To improve review B, students should:

- Avoid
- It was awful.
- The staff were terrible.
- Never go there!
 - ✓ Replace with
- The service did not meet my expectations.
- The food was less impressive than I had hoped.
- Some improvements could be made to...

This makes the writing more balanced and fair.

6. Structure Your Review Clearly

Introduction:

- name of restaurant
- when you went
- basic impression

Main Body:

- decor
- service
- food
- price/value

Conclusion:

- who you recommend it to– final evaluation
