# A - An - Some - Any

**A / AN + singular countable nouns**

**A** + CONSONANT SOUND

There is **a** bottle on the table.

**AN** + VOWEL SOUND

There is **an** apple on the table.

**SOME / ANY + plural countable nouns & uncountable nouns**

**+** affirmative **SOME** There is **some** cheese in the fridge.

**-** negative **ANY** There isn't **any** cheese in the fridge.

**?** questions \* **ANY** Is there **any** cheese in the fridge?

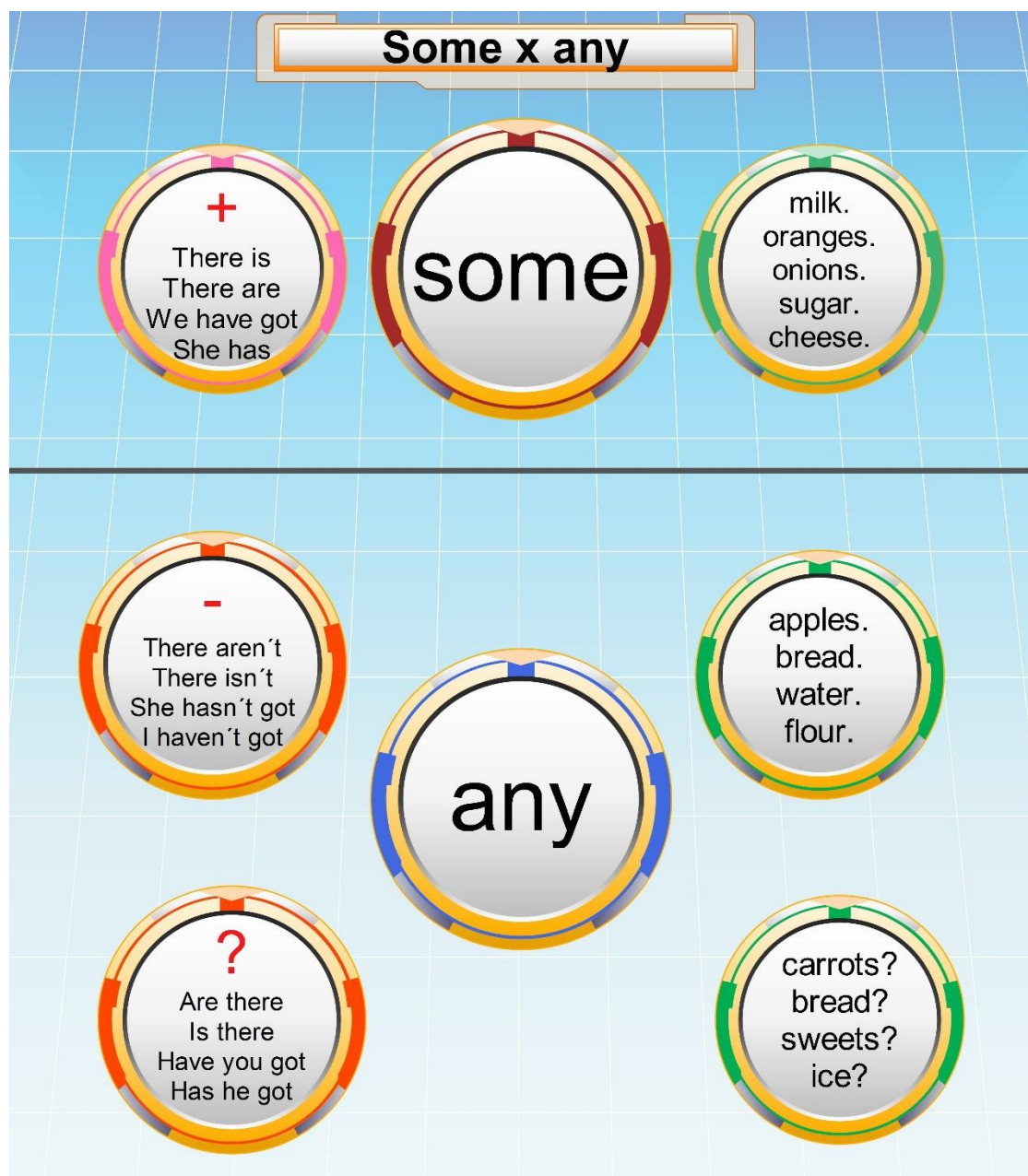

Use *a/an*, *some*, *any* and *lots of* to say how much of something there is.  
Nouns can be divided into countable (a banana, six eggs) or uncountable (some ice cream, some salad).

	Countable nouns	Uncountable nouns
<b>Affirmative sentences</b>	There's <b>a banana</b> . There are <b>some eggs</b> . There are <b>lots of apples</b> .	There's <b>some salad</b> . There's <b>lots of ice cream</b> .
<b>Negative sentences</b>	There aren't <b>any grapes</b> .	There isn't <b>any lemonade</b> .
<b>Questions</b>	Are there <b>any kiwis</b> ?	Is there <b>any bread</b> ?
<b>Note:</b> Use <i>some</i> in affirmative sentences. Use <i>any</i> in negative sentences and questions.
