



- There are two main ways to conduct a survey:
 - Face-to-face
 - Using a questionnaire
- There are pros and cons to each method

Surveys

Face-to-face

- PROS
 - Can make sure people understand the questions and complete the whole survey
 - Enables follow up questions
- CONS
 - Takes a long time
 - Expensive to pay someone to do the interview
 - Can be intimidating

Questionnaire

- PROS
 - Cheap
 - Can be giving to lots of people
 - Easy to collect in
 - People can take their time
- CONS
 - People can misunderstand questions
 - People can leave questions
 - Might not do it altogether
