**Learning objective: students should be able to use first conditional to talk about the possible future result of an action**

### First conditional

- A first conditional sentence talks about a possible event in the future. The speaker thinks it might happen.
- The *if* clause describes the possible event. The result clause describes the result.

***If* clause (if + present simple)**

**Result clause (will + verb)**

If I **see** any rubbish on the street,

I'll **put** it in a rubbish bin.

If you **study** hard,

you'll **learn** English faster.

- **Note:** The verb in the *if* clause is in the present, but it's describing the future.
- The result clause can also come first: *You'll learn English faster if you study hard.*



**When the if clause is first ,we need a comma at the end of the clause.**

If I don't go to bed now , I'll be too tired tomorrow.

He'll fail his exam if he doesn't work harder.
