Learning objective: students should be able to use first conditional to talk about the possible future result of an action

First conditional

- A first conditional sentence talks about a possible event in the future. The speaker thinks it might happen.
- The if clause describes the possible event. The result clause describes the result.

If clause (if + present simple) Result clause (will + verb) I'll put it in a rubbish bin. If I see any rubbish on the street, you'll learn English faster. If you study hard,

- Note: The verb in the if clause is in the present, but it's describing the future.
- The result clause can also come first: You'll learn English faster if you study hard.



 \nearrow When the if clause is first ,we need $\,$ a comma at the end of the clause.

If I don't go to bed now, I'll be too tired tomorrow.

He'll fail his exam if he doesn't work harder.
