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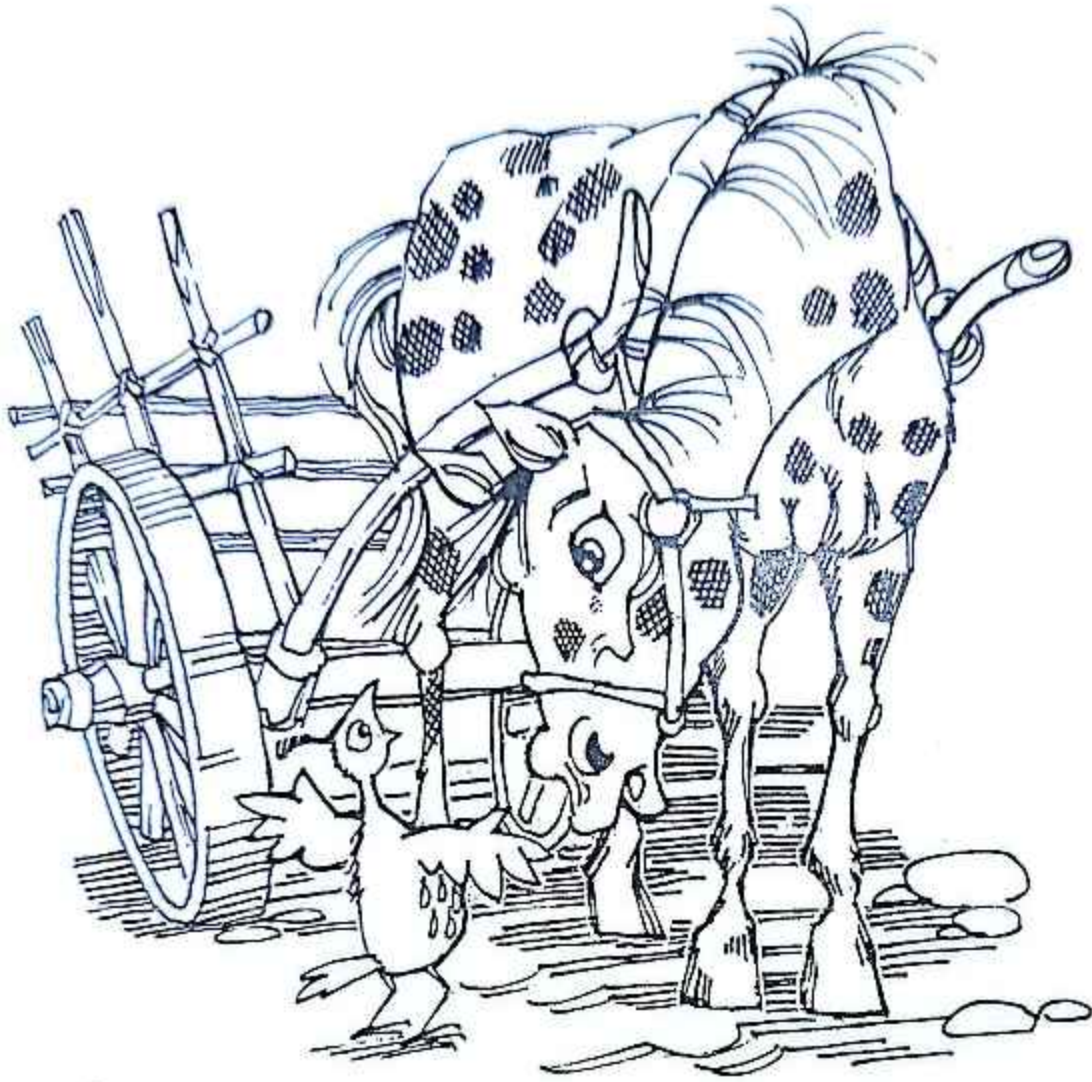
“I want something new for dinner,” says the King. “How about quail?”

“Oh, no!” says Quail. “The King wants quail for dinner. I am in danger. I cannot stay here. I will have to run away by myself!”



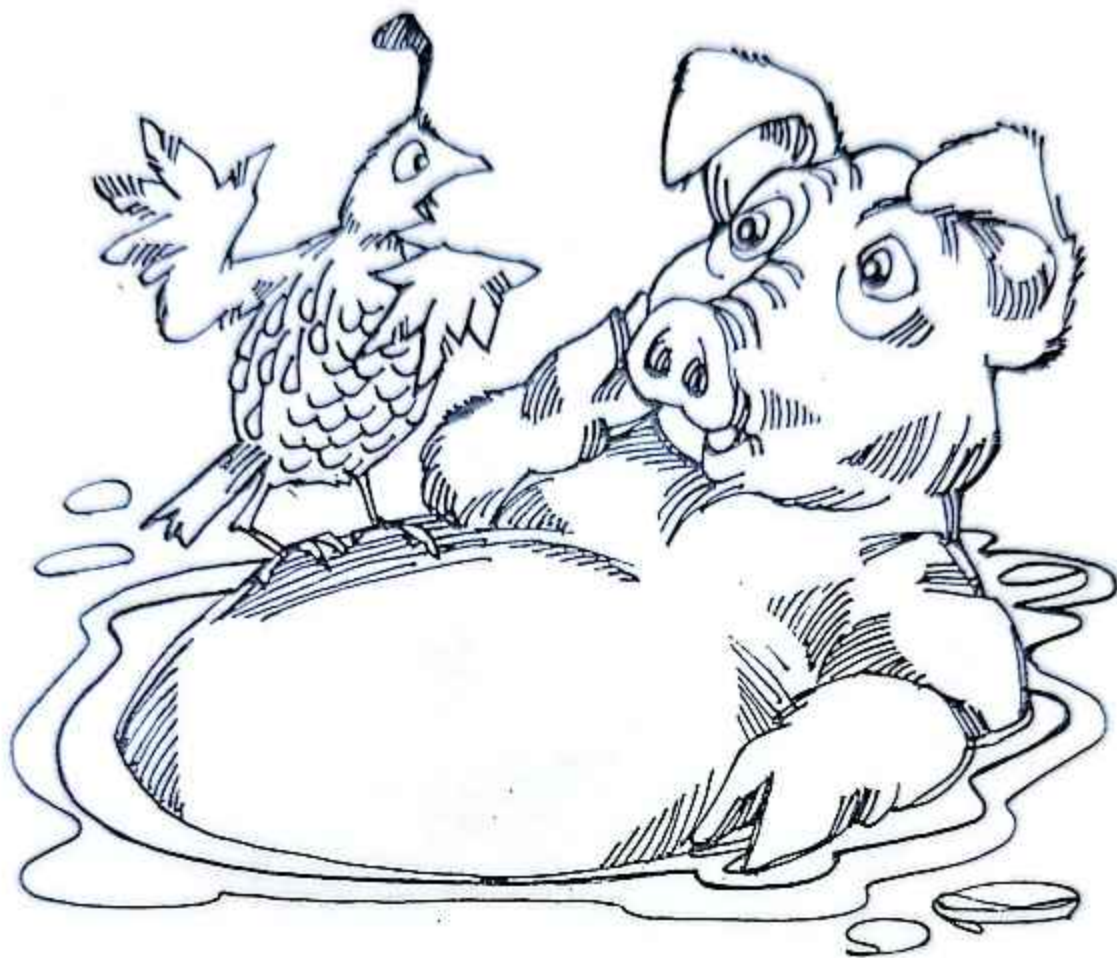
On her way, Quail meets

"I am going away," says Quail. "The King wants quail for dinner. And the King always gets what he wants."



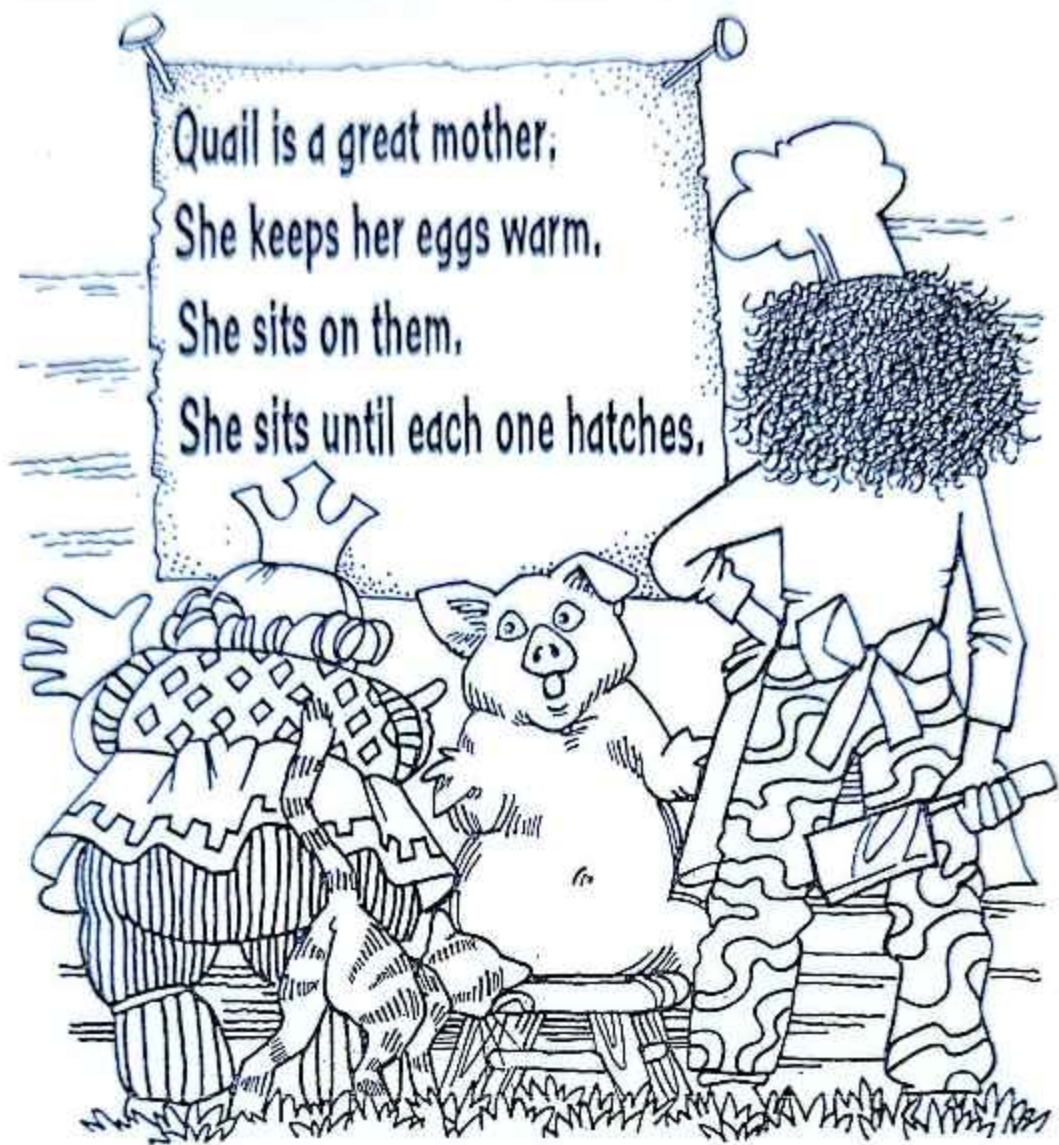
Pig says, "Just keep going. I

Pig makes a sign. He puts it on the barn. It says:

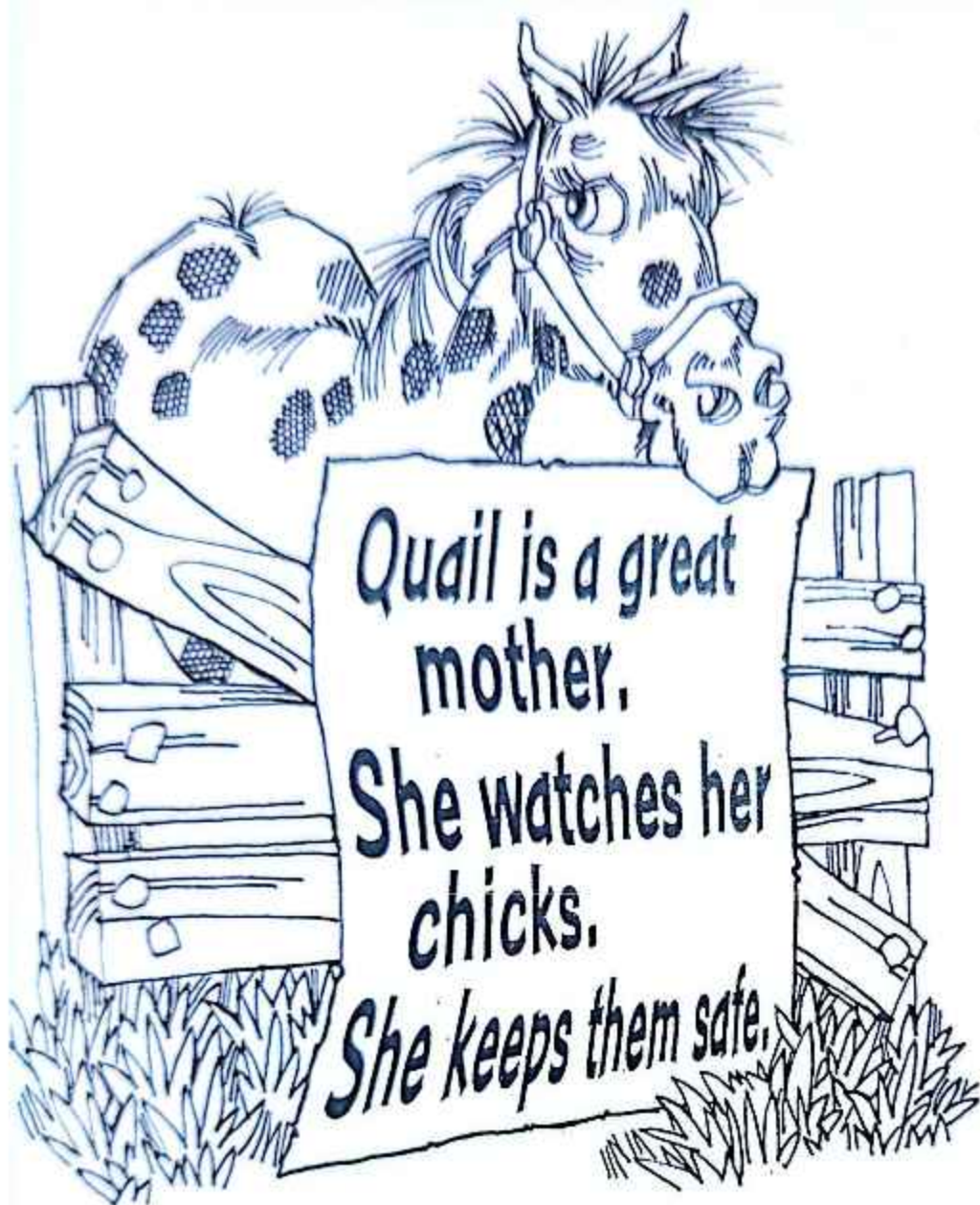
Quail is a great mother.

Phonics for Families: This book features words with the long *a* sound, such as *apron*, *quail*, and *way*, and words with endings *-ing*, *-s*, and *-es*. It also provides practice reading the words *mother*, *new*, *warm*, *keep*, and *myself*. Encourage your child to make a sign that uses some of these words.

Phonics Skills: Long *a* spelled *a*, *ai*, *ay*; Inflected endings *-es*, *-ing*, *-s* (without spelling change)

High-Frequency Words: *mother*, *new*, *warm*, *keep*, *myself*
