Comparative and superlative adjectives

Adjectives have **three forms**:

- 1 **Positive** → basic form (He is tall)
- 2 **Comparative** → compares **two** people or things (Tom is taller than John)
- 3 **Superlative** → compares **three or more** people or things (Tom is the tallest in the class.)

Example:

- tall → taller → the tallest

Type of Adjective	Rule for Comparative	Example (Comparative)	Rule for Superlative	Example (Superlative)
1 syllable adjectives	Add -er	tall → taller	Add -est	tall → the tallest
Ends in -e	Add -r	nice → nicer	Add -st	nice → the nicest
CVC pattern (consonant–vowel–consonant)	Double last letter + -er	big → bigger	Double last letter + -est	big → the biggest
Two syllables ending in -y	Change y → i + -er	happy → happier	Change y → i + -est	happy → the happiest
Two or more syllables	more + adjective	beautiful → more beautiful	the most + adjective	beautiful → the most beautiful
Irregular adjectives	Change the word completely	good → better bad → worse	Change the word completely	good → the best bad → the worst
