## **Question Tags**

A question tag is a short question added to the end of a sentence.

It is formed using do\does\did (in simple tenses) or the auxiliary (am, is, are, was, were +have, has)+ a pronoun.

A positive sentence usually has a negative question tag.

A negative sentence has a positive question tag.

Subject	<b>Positive Sentence</b> → <b>Negative Tag</b>	<b>Negative Sentence</b> → <b>Positive Tag</b>
Ι	I am late, aren't I? (special form)	I'm not late, am I?
You	You are tired, aren't you?	You aren't tired, <b>are you</b> ?
Не	He is happy, <b>isn't he</b> ?	He isn't happy, <b>is he</b> ?
She	She can drive, can't she?	She can't drive, can she?
It	It is cold today, <b>isn't it</b> ?	It isn't cold, is it?
We	We have finished, haven't we?	We haven't finished, have we?
They	They work hard, <b>don't they</b> ?	They don't work hard, do they?

## \*General Rules for Question Tags

- 1. Positive sentence → Negative tag
- She is smart, isn't she?
- 2. Negative sentence → Positive tag
- They don't like tea, do they?
- 3. The pronoun in the tag = subject in the sentence
- The students are tired, aren't they?
- 4. Use the same auxiliary verb (be, do, have, modal)
- He can swim, can't he?
- She has finished, hasn't she?
- They worked hard, didn't they?
