## Lesson 6A – Speaking: Telling an Anecdote

## **Key Vocabulary**

## A. Starting an Anecdote

Expression	Arabic Meaning	Example from the lesson
Guess what?	خمن ماذا حدث؟	Guess what?
You'll never believe this, but	لن تصدّق هذا، ولكن	You'll never believe this, but I forgot to take my umbrella.
It was about three in the morning when	كانت حوالي الساعة الثالثة صباحًا عندما	It was about three in the morning when I heard a noise.
One day / One time	, =	One time, I was walking home
I'll never forget the moment when	لن أنسى اللحظة عندما	I'll never forget the moment when I realized the truth.
Well, I was a little taken aback	تفاجأت قليلاً	Well, I was a little taken aback when I saw him.

## B. Giving Background Information

Expression	Arabic Meaning	Example
A friend of mine told me this story	أحد أصدقائي أخبرني هذه القصة	A friend of mine told me this story.
I was out walking	كنت خارجًا أتمشى	I was out walking when it started to rain.
I'm not sure if you know, but	لست متأكدًا إن كنت تعلم، ولكن	I'm not sure if you know, but this myth is very famous.
There was this guy who	كان هناك شخص	There was this guy who thought he saw a ghost.

### C. Introducing a Turning Point

Expression	Arabic Meaning	Example from the lesson

Expression	Arabic Meaning	Example from the lesson
Suddenly	فجأة	Suddenly, I heard someone shout!
Before I had time to	قبل أن أجد وقتًا لـ	Before I had time to react, he disappeared.
No sooner than	ما إن حتى	No sooner had they huddled together <b>than</b> the wind blew a hole in the basement.
Hardly had we when	بالكاد حتى	Hardly had we started <b>when</b> it began to rain.
Before we knew what was happening	قبل أن نعرف ما الذي يحدث	Before we knew what was happening, everything went dark.

## D. Explaining a Surprise or Result

Expression	Arabic Meaning	Example from the lesson
I couldn't believe what was happening.	لم أستطع تصديق ما كان يحدث.	I couldn't believe what was happening when the lights went out.
I was absolutely amazed / shocked.	كنت مندهشًا / مصدومًا تمامًا.	I was absolutely amazed when I heard the story.
Unexpectedly / unbelievably	_	Unbelievably, she was rude to a doctor in front of everyone.
Then, out of the blue	فجأة وبدون مقدمات	Then, out of the blue, the door opened.

## E. Ending / Rounding Off

Expression	Arabic Meaning	Example
Anyway	على أي حال	Anyway, that's what happened.
In the end	في النهاية	In the end, everything turned out fine.
I'll never forget it.	لن أنساه أبداً.	I'll never forget it.
I'll never again.	لن مرة أخرى.	l'll never walk alone at night again.

## Sentence Adverbs from the Listening (Exercise 5)

These adverbs show the speaker's attitude.

Adverb	Meaning	Example from lesson
Obviously	من الواضح	Obviously, I forgot to take an umbrella.
Theoretically	نظريًا	Theoretically, you don't need any help to do this.

Adverb	Meaning	Example from lesson
Seriously	بجدية	Seriously, I should have known it wouldn't rain.
Surprisingly	بشكل مفاجئ	Surprisingly, I had read that it was going to rain.
Unbelievably	بشكل لا يُصدق	Unbelievably, he doesn't like people; I've never seen him smile.
Surely	بالتأكيد	Surely, I'm nice, but a lot of people aren't very nice.
Theoretically / Clearly	بوضوح / بشكل نظري	Clearly, you were rude to a person you didn't know.

- Guess what?
- You'll never believe this, but...

### 2.Set the scene (background)

- I was out walking...
- A friend of mine told me this story...

#### 3. Turning point

- Suddenly...
- No sooner had we arrived than...

### 4. What happened next (reaction)

- I couldn't believe what was happening.
- Unexpectedly...

### 5. End your story

- Anyway, that's what happened.
- I'll never forget it.
