1	Describing ongoing background action	e / d / b
2	Event in progress interrupted by single action	b (man racing vs. the narrator reacting)
3	Action completed before a time in the past	С
4	Single completed action in past	a / f
5	Action in progress up to a point in past	d

From the last paragraph:

No sooner had the man pulled the woman away than the crane crashed to the ground.

Used to add emphasis and show the two actions happened quickly one after the other.

- ✓ Use an interesting title
- **✓** Begin in the middle of the action
- **✓** Use different past tenses
- ✓ Use time expressions (before, after, first)
- **✓** Use direct speech
- ✓ Use negative inversion for emphasis

MODEL STORY

"Malak hadn't imagined that her day would be a disaster."

Malak hadn't imagined that her day would be a disaster.

a She was standing in the middle of the crowded street, staring helplessly at the bus disappearing around the corner. Her bag – with her wallet, homework, and phone – was still inside. She **yelled**, "Wait! Stop!" but the driver didn't hear her.

b My heart was **pounding** furiously as I ran after her. We had been **wandering** around the city earlier, taking photos and enjoying the weather, completely unaware of the chaos that was about to happen. The morning had started so well.

c Ten minutes before all this, Malak had **spotted** a man in a grey coat standing suspiciously close to us. He **peered** at us from behind a newspaper, then **muttered** into his phone. She had **glanced** at him but didn't think much of it, and we continued walking.

d Suddenly, Malak gasped. "My bag... it's gone!" she cried. Only then did we notice the same man **racing** through the street with her bag in his hand. "Hey! Come back!" she **yelled** as she chased him.

e No sooner had she started running than the man darted across the road and vanished into a narrow alley. With my back to the wall, I waited and tried to listen. For a moment, everything felt hopeless.

f Then something unexpected happened. A construction worker stepped out of the alley holding Malak's bag. "Looking for this?" he asked. As he explained, he had seen the thief trying to hide it behind a pile of bricks. He had grabbed it and scared the man off.

Malak let out a long breath of relief as she hugged the bag tightly. She glanced at me and laughed nervously. "Maybe today wasn't a complete disaster after all," she said, smiling for the first time that day.
