Future forms

In English, there are different ways to talk about the future depending on the meaning we want to express. Here are the main future forms:

- Will (future simple): Used for predictions, promises, offers, and decisions made at the moment of speaking.

Example: I will call you later.

- Going to: Used for plans and intentions or for predictions based on evidence.

Example: I'm going to study medicine. / Look at those clouds! It's going to rain.

- Present Continuous: Used for fixed arrangements in the near future.

Example: We are meeting them tomorrow.

- Present Simple: Used for timetables and schedules.

Example: The train leaves at 7:30.

- Future Continuous: Used for actions that will be in progress at a certain point in the future.

Example: This time tomorrow, I will be flying to New York.

- Future Perfect: Used for actions that will be completed before a specific time in the future.

Example: By 2025, I will have finished my studies.

2. Comparing "Will" and "Going To"

Will:

- Used for decisions made at the moment of speaking.

Example: (At a restaurant) I think I will have a pizza.

- Used for predictions based on opinions or beliefs (without clear evidence).
Example: I think it will rain tomorrow.
- Used for promises, offers, and requests.
Example: Don't worry, I will help you.

Going To:

- Used for plans and intentions that have already been decided.
Example: I'm going to visit my grandparents next weekend.
- Used for predictions based on present evidence.
Example: Look at the sky! It's going to rain.
