What do you know about Emily Brontë? What did she write?

Example Answer:

Emily Brontë lived a short life (1818–1848), but she left a lasting impact on English literature. She is best known for her novel *Wuthering Heights*, which is famous for its wild Yorkshire moors setting and its complex characters driven by love, hatred, and revenge. Emily also wrote poetry and published her poems under the pen name *Ellis Bell*, along with her sisters Charlotte and Anne. Although little is known about her personal life, *Wuthering Heights* remains a powerful and fascinating novel.

الإجابة المقترحة:

عاشت إيميلي برونتي حياة قصيرة (1818–1848)، لكنها تركت أثرًا كبيرًا في الأدب الإنجليزي. اشتهرت بروايتها مرتفعات ويزرينغ، التي تتميز بمكانها القاسي في مستنقعات يوركشاير وشخصياتها المعقدة التي تحركها مشاعر الحب والكراهية والانتقام. كما كتبت إيميلي الشعر ونشرتة باسم مستعار هو *إليس بيل* مع شقيقتها شارلوت وأن. وعلى الرغم من قلة المعلومات عن حياتها الشخصية، ما تزال رواية *مرتفعات ويزرينغ* عملاً أدبيًا مؤثرًا وجذابًا.

Extract 1

While Catherine was out of the room, Ellen Dean spoke to Mr. Edgar Linton. She felt she should warn her master that Heathcliff had returned.

بينما كانت كاثرين خارج الغرفة، تحدثت إلين دين إلى السيد إدغار لينتون، وشعرت أنه يجب عليها تحذير سيدها من عودة هيثكليف.

Mr. Linton reacted angrily and referred to Heathcliff as a “gypsy.” Ellen asked him not to insult Heathcliff, explaining that Catherine had been deeply upset when Heathcliff left.

When Catherine entered the room, she was extremely excited to hear of Heathcliff’s return. Heathcliff explained that he had spent three years in the army and had earned money. He appeared stronger, and his speech, manners, and clothes had clearly improved.

Summary of Extract 1 (ملخص)

Extract 2

In November 1801, Mr. Lockwood decided to leave London and move to the countryside. He visited a house on the Yorkshire moors called Wuthering Heights, owned by a man named Heathcliff.

في نوفمبر عام 1801، قرر السيد لوكوود مغادرة لندن والانتقال إلى الريف، فزار منزلًا في مستنقعات يوركشاير يُدعى مرتفعات ويذرينغ، وكان يملكه رجل يُدعى هيثكليف.

Lockwood found Heathcliff rude and unwelcoming. During his visit, the boy and the young woman treated him coldly. Heathcliff impatiently refused Lockwood’s request to stay due to the snow, making it clear that he was not a welcome guest.
