



Connectives (Linking Words) p. 130

Connectives are words we use to join sentences, ideas, or paragraphs.

Examples of Connectives

Addition: and, also, as well as, too

Time / Order: first, then, after that, finally

Contrast: but, however, although

Cause & Effect: because, so

Examples

I like apples **and** oranges.

It was raining, **so** we stayed at home.

Although he was tired, he finished his homework.

First, I woke up. **Then**, I went to school. **Finally**, I went to bed.
