1. athlete

- Noun: athlete – a person who plays sports. *She is a talented athlete.*
- Adjective: athletic – strong and good at sports. *He has an athletic body.*

2. compete

- Verb: compete – to try to win. *Our team will compete in the final.*
- Noun: competition – an event where people try to win. *She won the swimming competition.*
- Noun: competitor – a person who competes. *There are many competitors in the race.*

- Adjective: competitive – wanting to win. *He is very competitive.*

3. confident

- Adjective: confident – sure about yourself. *She feels confident before the exam.*
- Noun: confidence – belief in yourself. *His confidence is growing.*
- Adverb: confidently – in a confident way. *He spoke confidently in front of the class.*

4. enjoy

- Verb: enjoy – to like something. *I enjoy playing football.*
- Noun: enjoyment – pleasure. *Reading gives her enjoyment.*
- Adjective: enjoyable – fun or pleasant

It was an enjoyable trip.

5. instruct

- Verb: instruct – to teach or give orders. *The teacher instructed the students to listen.*
- Noun: instruction – information or orders. *Follow the instructions carefully.*
- Noun: instructor – a person who teaches. *He is a swimming instructor.*

6. success

- Noun: success – achieving what you want. *The project was a success.*
- Adjective: successful – achieving good results. *She is a successful athlete.*
- Verb: succeed – to achieve something. *He succeeded in winning the race.*
- Adverb: successfully – in a successful way. *They completed the task successfully.*

7. freedom

- Noun: freedom – the state of being free. *Everyone deserves freedom.*

- Adjective: free – not controlled or limited. *The birds are free.*
- Verb: free – to allow someone to be free. *The country was freed from occupation.*

8. danger

- Noun: danger – the possibility of harm. *There is danger in driving too fast.*
- Adjective: dangerous – likely to cause harm. *This road is dangerous.*
- Adjective: safe – not in danger. *This place is safe.*

9. fitness

- Noun: fitness – being healthy and strong. *Exercise improves fitness.*
- Adjective: fit – healthy and strong. *She is very fit.*
- Verb: fit – to be the right size. *These shoes fit me well.*

10. profession

- Noun: profession – a job that needs training. *Teaching is a noble profession.*
- Noun: professional – a skilled worker. *He is a professional coach.*
- Adjective: professional – serious and skilled. *She behaved in a professional way.*

11. strength

- Noun: strength – physical or mental power. *He used his strength to lift the box.*
- Adjective: strong – having strength. *She is strong enough to win.*
- Verb: strengthen – to make stronger. *Exercise strengthens the muscles.*

12. dive

- Verb: dive – to jump into water. *The boy dived into the pool.*
- Noun: dive – a jump into water. *That was a perfect dive.*

- Noun: diver – a person who dives. *The diver won a gold medal.*

13. deep

- Adjective: deep – far down. *The lake is very deep.*
- Noun: depth – how deep something is. *We measured the depth of the water.*
- Adverb: deeply – in a deep way / strongly. *She was deeply affected.*
