| <b>Crime</b>       | An illegal act punishable by law.                          |
| <b>Victim</b>      | A person who suffers from a crime.                         |
| <b>Suspect</b>     | A person believed to have committed a crime.               |
| <b>Witness</b>     | Someone who sees a crime happen.                           |
| <b>Evidence</b>    | Proof used in a crime investigation.                       |
| <b>Proof</b>       | Information or evidence that shows something is true.      |
| <b>Alibi</b>       | A claim that a person was elsewhere when a crime happened. |
| <b>Innocent</b>    | Not guilty of a crime or offense.                          |
| <b>Accuse</b>      | To formally say someone has committed a crime.             |
| <b>Defendant</b>   | The person accused of a crime in court.                    |
| <b>Jury</b>        | A group of people who decide the outcome of a trial.       |
| <b>Judge</b>       | The official in charge of a court trial.                   |
| <b>Trial</b>       | A court process to determine guilt or innocence.           |
| <b>Case</b>        | A legal matter or investigation handled by authorities.    |
| <b>Sentence</b>    | The punishment given to a guilty person.                   |
| <b>Bail</b>        | Money paid to be released from jail before trial.          |
| <b>Crime Scene</b> | The location where a crime took place.                     |
| <b>Offender</b>    | A person who commits a crime.                              |

| <b>Theft</b>    | Stealing something that belongs to someone else. |
| <b>Burglary</b> | Entering a building illegally to commit a crime. |
| <b>Robbery</b>  | Stealing from a person using force or threats.   |
| <b>Fraud</b>    | Deception for personal or financial gain.        |
| <b>Forgery</b>  | Faking documents or signatures illegally.        |
| <b>Murder</b>   | Killing someone intentionally and unlawfully.    |
