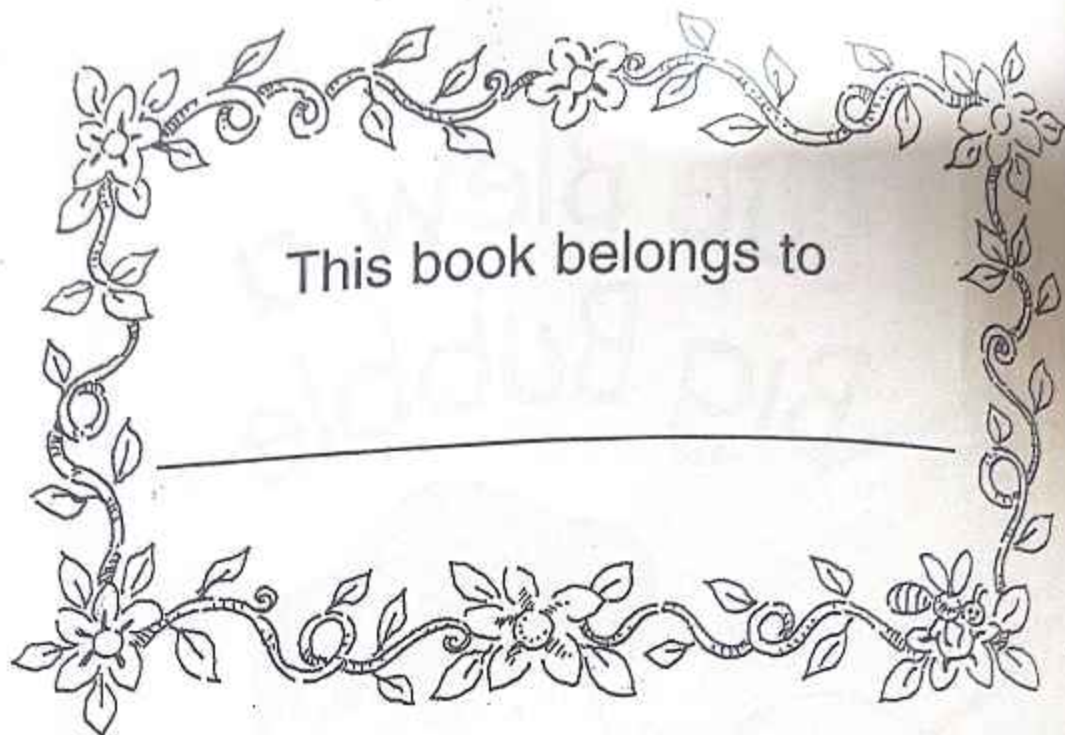

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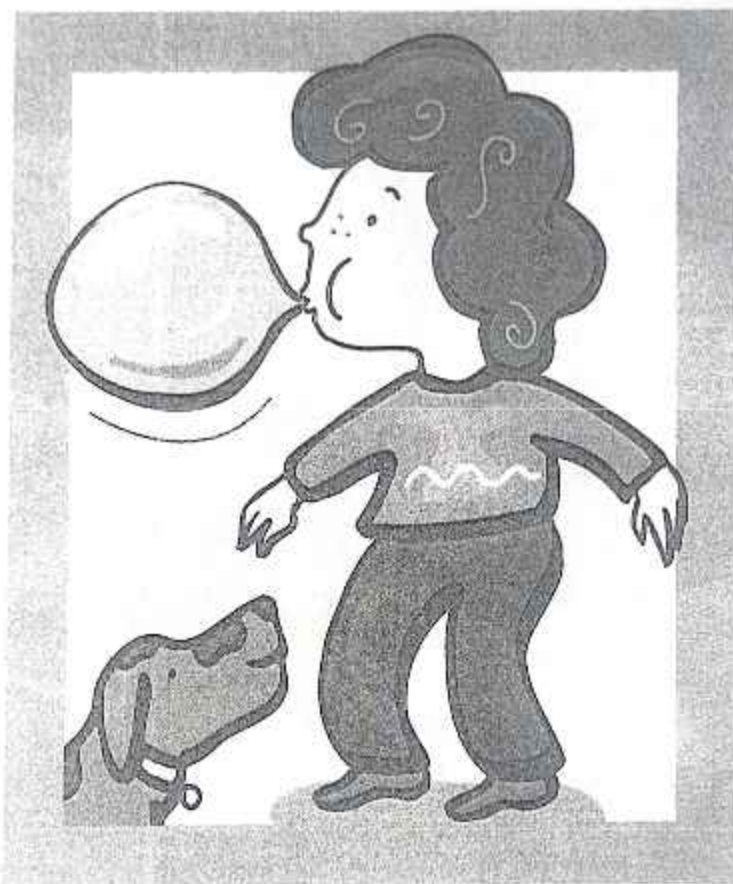

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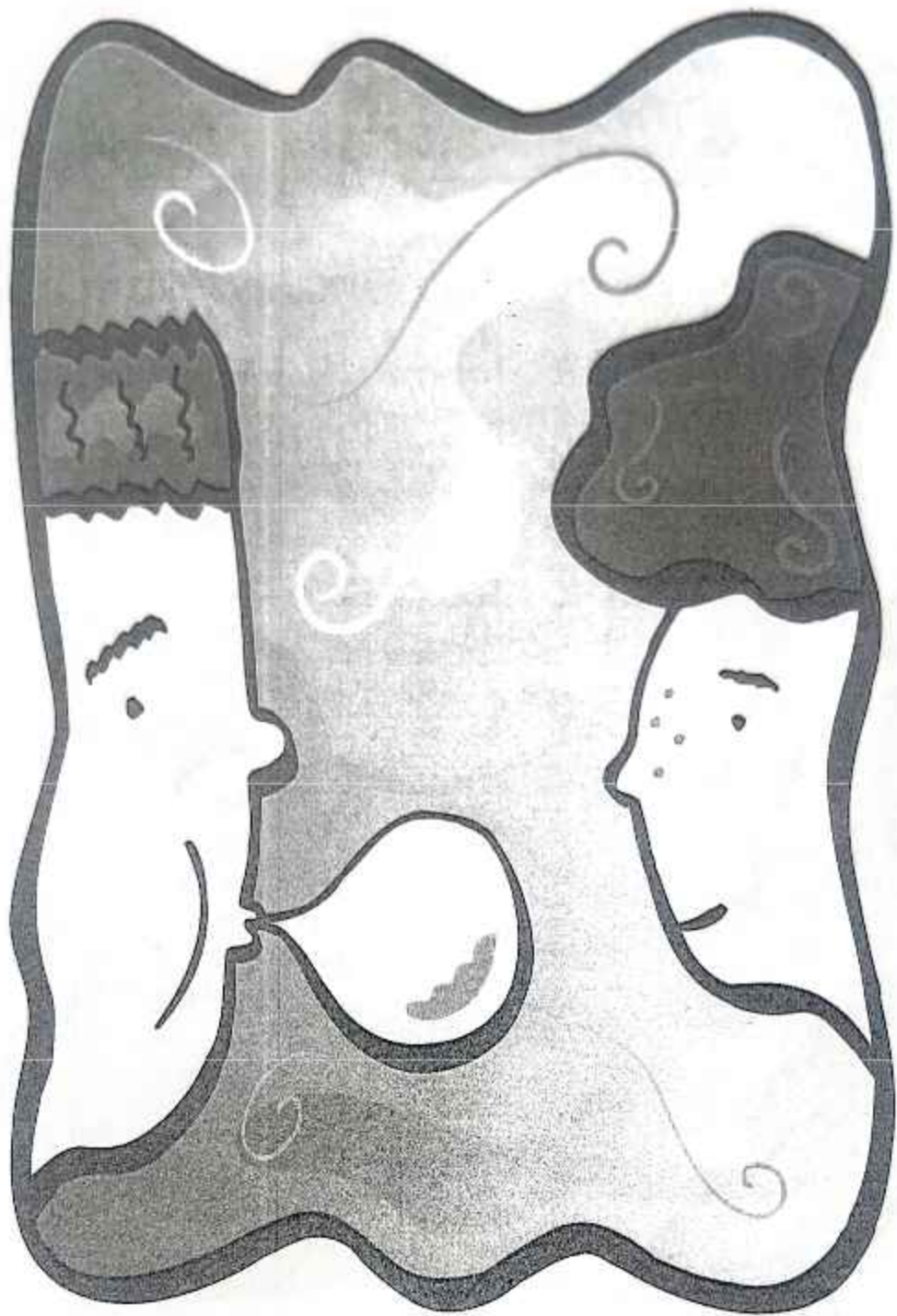


This is Sue.

Here's a clue:

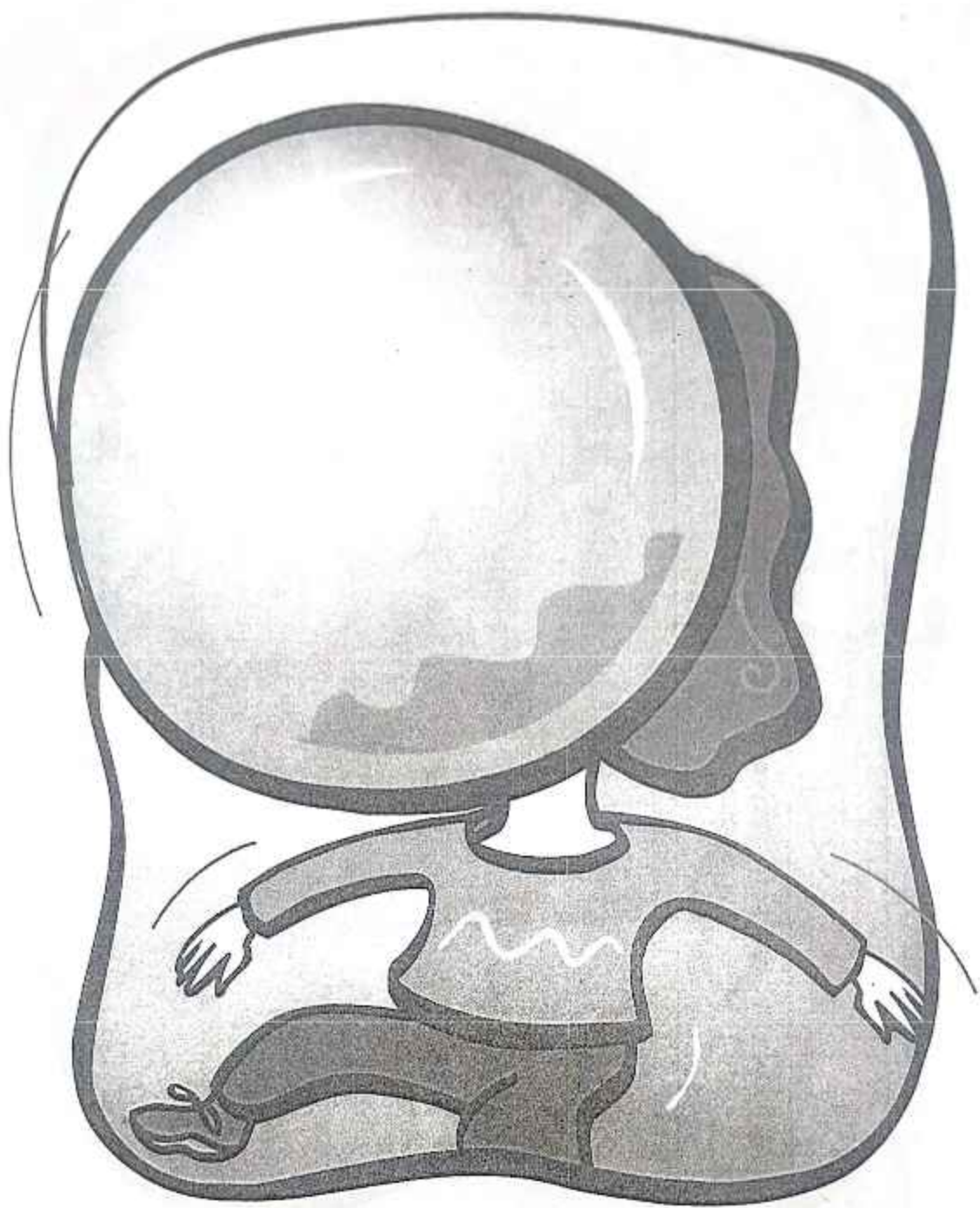




Sue watches people chew.

Drew teaches Sue.



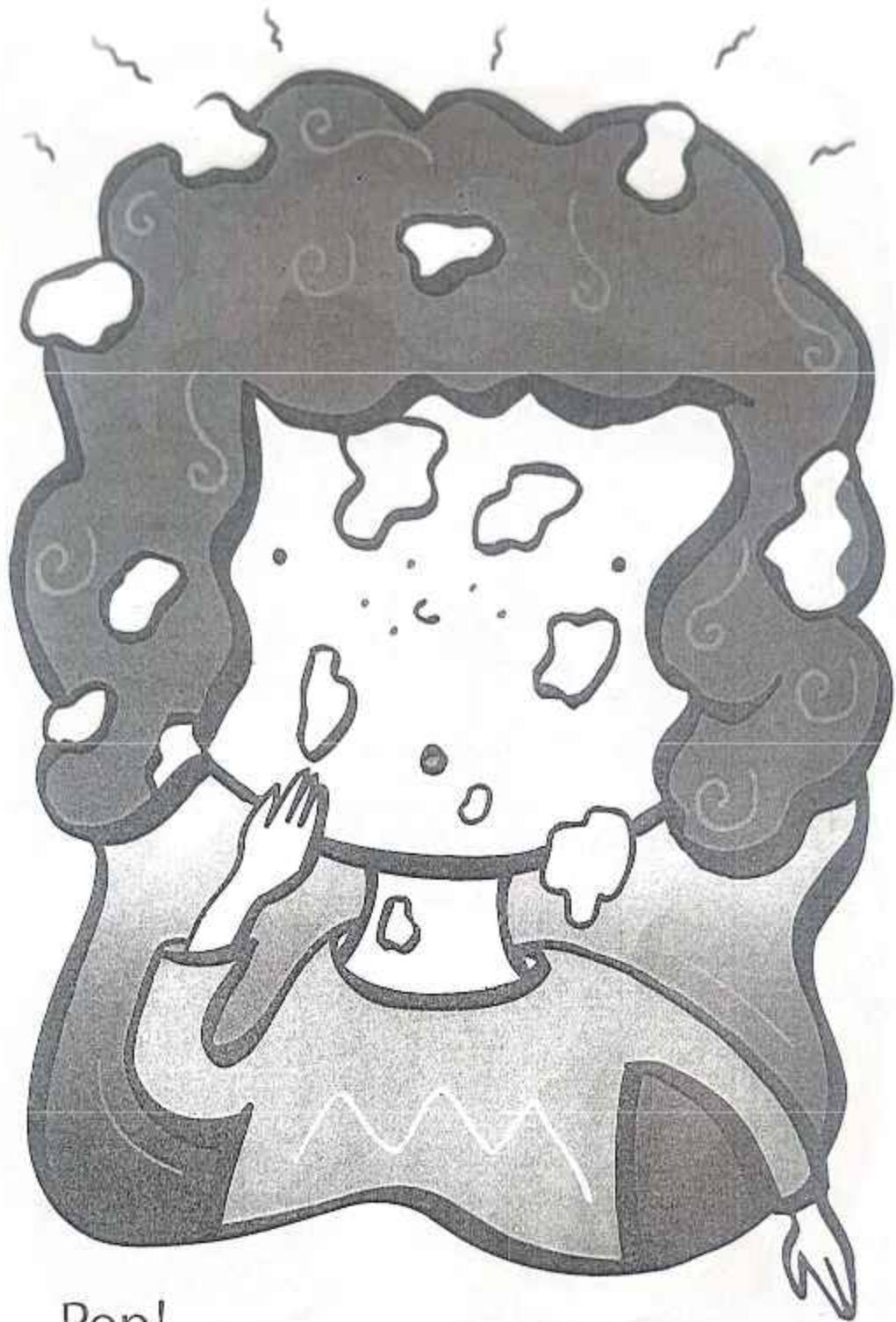
Sue chews and chews.

Phonics for Families: This book provides practice reading words with the vowel patterns *ew* and *ue*, as in *chew* and *clue*; action words that end with *-es*; plurals that are formed by adding *-es*; and the high-frequency words *better*, *people*, and *give*. Read the story together. Then ask your child to find the story words with the vowel patterns *ew* and *ue*.

Phonics Skills: Vowel patterns *ew*, *ue*; Inflected ending *-es*; Plurals *-es*
