





She is big!




Here is little Sue.

Here's a clue:




Sue watches people chew. Most of all she watches Drew. Drew teaches Sue.




Sue chews and chews.

Here's a clue:




Sue finds her mother. Mom knows what to do.

High-Frequency Words: better, people, give


